





This notice is a demand for your 2001 tax return.

Why do we believe you need to file a 2001 California income tax return?

Our records show that you earned income, reported on federal form 1099, from LA CITY EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM

We checked our records, but we could not locate a 2001 California personal income tax return for you.

We understand that you may have already filed your return, that you may not have had a chance to file for 2001 yet, or that you may not have a filing requirement. We would like to work with you to resolve this matter as soon as possible.

Refer to the Filing Requirement Guidelines on Page 2 of this notice for 2001 income and filing requirements. You must file even if you believe you are due a refund.

Filed Already?

What should you do to respond to this notice?

The quickest way to resolve this matter is to visit our Website at www.ftb.ca.gov/inc. You can also call our automated phone service at (866) 204-7902. You will be prompted to enter the social security number under which you filed your tax return, so please have a copy of your return ready. Or, **complete Section A** of the "Reply to FTB" (enclosed) and send it in with a copy of your return.

No filing Requirement?

If you believe you do not have a requirement to file, or are unsure if you have a requirement to file, quick resolution is available through our Website at www.ftb.ca.gov/inc. You may also call our automated phone service at (866) 204-7902 (available 24 hours a day), or **complete Section B** of the "Reply to FTB" (enclosed) and return it to us by May 26, 2004

Haven't Filed Yet?

If you have a requirement to file but have not filed yet, please complete your 2001 personal income tax return and send it to us. Since you did not file your return on time, we will assess a late filing penalty and applicable interest if your return shows a balance due. In addition, if you do not file by May 26, 2004 we will assess tax, interest and a

2001 CALIFORNIA FILING REQUIREMENT GUIDELINES

Read down the first column to find your filing status at the end of 2001. Read across to find your age at the end of 2001, and number of dependents you are entitled to claim for 2001. You must file a return if either your California gross income or your California adjusted gross income was more than the amount shown for your filing status, age, and number of dependents.

Even if you do not have a filing requirement based on the chart below, you should file a return in order to get a refund if California state income tax was withheld from your pay, or if you made California estimated tax payments.

California gross Income is all income you received in the form of money, goods, property, and services from all sources that are not exempt from tax. Gross income does not include any adjustments or deductions.

2 California adjusted gross income is your federal adjusted gross income from all sources reduced or increased by all California income adjustments.

The income of both spouses must be combined, both spouses may be required to file a return even if only one spouse had income over the amounts listed. If your 65th birthday is on January 1, 2002, you are considered to be age 65 on December 31, 2001.

ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Where can I get the tax forms I need to file?

A: To order tax forms and publications call our toll-free number at (800) 338-0505. The quickest way to get prior and current year tax forms is to visit our website at www.ftb.ca.gov.

Q: What if I cannot pay the amount due on my return?

A: It is important that you file even if you cannot pay. We will work with you to set up a monthly installment agreement once you file your return. For more information, call (916) 845-4470. You can make credit card payments by calling (888) 2 PAY-TAX and entering code 1555.

Q: I am not a resident of California, why did I get this notice?

A: Even if you are not a resident of California, you must file a California tax return and pay tax on income derived from a California source. Examples of California source income include gain from the sale of property located in California, income from a partnership or S corporation doing business in California, wages earned while working in California, income from a California rental property, and payments received for services performed in California. You should file your return using our form 540NR. For additional information on nonresident or part-year resident filing requirements, please see California form FTB 1031 (or FTB form 1032 for military personnel).

Q: I cannot locate my W-2 form. What should I do?

A: If you cannot locate a copy of your W-2 form, contact your employer and ask for a copy to be sent to you. If you cannot obtain a copy, you may report your income on our Substitute for Form W-2 (form FTB 3525). You can get this form on our website, www.ftb.ca.gov, or by calling our tollfree number (800) 338-0505.

Q: What will happen if I do not respond to this notice?

A: If we send you a demand the law requires you to respond to the notice by: (1) filing your 2001 California personal income tax return, or (2) providing information that you do not have a requirement to file, or (3) showing that you have already filed your 2001 tax return.

If you do not file the required return, we will assess the totlowing:


Tax based upon information available to us.

- A late return penalty for not filing your return by the due date. The penalty is generally 25% of your unpaid tax. However, a minimum late filing penalty of \$100 or 100% of your tax due (whichever is less) is assessed. All returns filed late are subject to this penalty. (R&TC Section 19131)
- Interest on the assessed tax and penalties. (R&TC Section) 19101 & 19106)
- A demand penalty for failure to file a return after receiving this notice. This penalty is 25% of your total tax BEFORE applying any timely payments or withholding credits. This means you could receive a penalty even if you had a refund due. (R&TC Section 19133).
- A cost recovery fee to cover the cost of taking action to enforce your filing requirement. (R&TC Section 19254)


